12	Black-footed ferret	Mustela nigripes	1300	EN	Maximum estimate. 1000 wild and 300 domestic. Almost went extinct in the 1980s.
13	Island fox	Urocyon littoralis	1500	CR	Maximum estimate in 2002. Numbers had declined from 6000 in 1994 and appear to be continuing the trend, so present numbers are likely much lower.

56	Brown bear	<i>Ursus arctos</i>	200 000	LC	Minimum estimate. Russia has the largest number of brown bears, believed to exceed 100,000, while estimates in the U.S. are around 33,000 (most in Alaska), Canada 25,000, and Europe (excluding Russia) 14,000.
57	South American sea lion	<i>Otaria flavescens</i>	250 000	LC	Minimum estimate.
